O9 Find 12 small pebbles, sticks, or leaves. Put them into 2 equal groups. Next, put them into 4 equal groups. Can you make 6 equal groups? Can you find one more way to make equal groups?

G2 Find a stick. Estimate how many pennies long it is. Then check your estimate. How close were you?

I20 Find a ball or small stuffed animal. Play "I Spy" by placing the object in a different location around a room or outside. Use the words *up, down, over, under, before, after, in front of, behind, next to, inside, or outside*, to describe where the object is located.

O14 Count the number of windows in your house. Write the number. Then tell the number that is one more and one less.

B6 Make cards for the numbers 1-10. Put them in different places outside. Run to the places in order. Extension: write the ordinal words, first, second, etc.

N7 Draw more than 12 circles. Circle a group of 10. How many are left? How many more do you need to make another group of 10?

B13 Draw a picture using only squares, circles, rectangles, and triangles. Talk about your picture with an adult.

G3 Look at a calendar. Tell how many days are in June. Tell which day is the first day in June. Tell what date is the last Wednesday in June.

I15 Look at a calendar. Tell the date of the first Sunday of July. Count how many Saturdays are in July. Jimmy has swim lessons on every Tuesday and Thursday in July. Tell on which dates he will go swimming.

N21 Find 10 items around your house or outside. Order them from largest to smallest.

G11 Tell three ways a triangle and square are different. Tell three ways a triangle and square are alike.

I1 Write your phone number. Order the digits from greatest to least. Find the sum of the first three digits. Find the sum of the last four digits.

O18 Gather some pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters. Find three different ways to make 15 cents. Find three different ways to make 20 cents. Find two different ways to make 50 cents.

N17 Draw a picture postcard of somewhere that is special to you or an imaginary place. On the back, write a short message. Mail it to a friend or relative.

B4 Practice letter writing in the sandbox, chalk on the sidewalk, or even a cookie sheet with salt.

O8 Let your child try her hand at writing words using yogurt, pudding, or fingerpaint spread onto the bottom of a baking sheet or disposable pan.

G16 Look for some chenille stems (also known as pipe cleaners) at your local craft store and have her bend, twist, and turn them to form letters and then words.

B25 Write one letter of the alphabet on an index card with a marker. Next, have your child glue raised objects, such as dried beans, corn, peas, lentils, sequins, small buttons, cotton balls, or pompoms, on each outlined letter.

N22 Sing nursery rhymes with your child such as 'Jack and Jill', 'Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star,' or the Alphabet Song when you're at home, in the car, or out and about.

I12 Dip the tip of a whole carrot into some paint and have your child trace over words you have written (or typed) or practice writing his own words on paper.
