O5 Create a pattern that has two different shapes and two different colors. Create a pattern that has two different shapes and two different numbers.

N7 Draw or make a clock that shows your favorite time of day. Then tell why this is your favorite time of day.

B2 Make popcorn today!
Glue the kernels onto paper to make the number that shows your age.

O14 Set a timer for 10 seconds. Together with a parent, sibling, or friend, jump as many times as you can in 10 seconds. Record how many times each person jumped.

G3 Add to find the total that everyone jumped altogether. You may use pennies to help you count.

B11 Collect 10 objects from outside. Sort the objects into at least 2 groups. Then make a graph to show your groups.

N22 Use chalk to draw a shape pattern on your sidewalk or driveway.

I8 Draw a map of your house or room. Label the items.

I4 Ask a family member to read a story to you. Point to the words as they read.

O20 Use a paintbrush and water to write letters or words on the sidewalk, driveway, or side of your house.

B13 Pick a letter. Find 5 things outside that start with that letter.

N25 Look at old family photographs. Talk about who is in each one and what happened.

B6 Gather 10 small items and put them on a tray. Study the tray for 30 seconds and then cover it up. Write down as many of the items as you can remember. See who remembers the most!

G21 Hide something in your house or yard. Tell someone else how to find it.

I23 Write the color names on cards. Put each card on an object that has that color.

N12 On a hot dry day take a paintbrush and a bucket of water out to the sidewalk or driveway. Have your child paint words with water on the concrete canvas.

O16 Paint words with cotton swabs. Swabs work best with paint, water colors, or food. Place one swab per color and a small amount of your medium in paper cups, a plastic egg carton, or muffin tins.
